

**PRIVACY NOTICE**  
**Data processing related to the Eurodesk Hungary “Your Stories” Call**

This privacy notice (hereinafter: **Notice**) aims to inform data subjects about the processing of their personal data in connection with the Eurodesk Hungary “Your Stories” call carried out by Tempus Közalapítvány (hereinafter: **TPF** or **Data Controller**), and about the rights and legal remedies available to data subjects.

The provisions of this Notice apply only to the personal data of natural persons. For further information, please visit the Data Controller’s website at <https://tka.hu/hasznalati-feltetelek>.

**1. DETAILS OF THE DATA CONTROLLER**

**2. DESCRIPTION OF DATA PROCESSING**

The Data Controller processes the personal data of natural persons who submit written content (articles, blog posts) or visual content (photographs, videos) for publication under the Eurodesk Hungary “Your Stories” call.

**Purpose and legal basis of processing**

## The categories of personal data processed

**A1–A3:** Full name; e-mail address; phone number (optional); submitted written content (blog post/article); cover photograph and any information directly discernible therefrom.

**A4:** Full name; submitted written content; photograph.

**A5:** Identification and contact data of the person concerned; data relevant to the subject matter of the request or legal claim.

*The Data Controller does not verify the personal data provided to it. The individual providing the data is entirely responsible for its accuracy and legal compliance.*

## Legal basis of processing

The legal basis for data processing activities A1–A3 and A5 is: **processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest by the Data Controller in the field of Hungarian education, training, research and development, and youth policy – Article 6(1)(e) GDPR.** The operation of the Eurodesk Hungary network and the provision of information on European mobility opportunities form an integral part of this public interest task.

The legal basis for data processing activity A4 (transfer to the European Youth Portal) is the data subject's **voluntary consent – Article 6(1)(a) GDPR.** Providing this consent is voluntary and is not a condition for submitting content.

*The Data Subject may object to processing on the legal basis necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest (Article 6(1)(e) GDPR) at any time, free of charge. In the event of an objection, the Data Controller may only continue to process the data if there are compelling legitimate grounds that override the interests, rights and freedoms of the data subject. The right to object may be exercised by sending an e-mail to the address provided in section 1.*

## Licence and warranty

By submitting content (written and/or photographic), the data subject grants Tempus Public Foundation (TPF) a licence, within the scope of the purposes described in this Notice, to **use, reproduce, translate and publicly share** the submitted work (article, photograph, video) on the online platforms, in the publications and at the events of Eurodesk Hungary and TPF, **free of charge and without time or geographical limits.** Content submitted and published under this call does not form part of the European Commission's communication or promotional activities.

By submitting content, the data subject declares and **warrants** that they have taken the photograph submitted or otherwise hold the necessary rights, and that they have obtained the consent of any identifiable third parties appearing in photographs and hold an appropriate legal basis under the GDPR in respect of those persons. The submitter is solely responsible for the clearance of rights and any consents obtained from third parties; any claims brought by third parties in this regard are borne exclusively by the submitter.

## 3. PERSONS AUTHORISED TO ACCESS THE DATA; TRANSFER OF PERSONAL DATA

Personal data may be accessed by those employees and authorised processors of TPF whose tasks require access (in particular the editorial, communications and data protection staff of Eurodesk Hungary). After publication, visitors to the relevant media platforms may also access the published content.

Published content will be made publicly accessible on the Data Controller's online platforms. Social media plug-ins integrated into the site (e.g. Facebook, Instagram) may transfer data outside the European Economic Area (EEA); the lawfulness of such transfers is ensured by the relevant platforms on the basis of Standard Contractual Clauses (SCCs) or the EU–US Data Privacy Framework. In the case of processing activity A4, content is transferred to the European Youth Portal operated by the European Commission ([https://europa.eu/youth/stories\\_en](https://europa.eu/youth/stories_en)), which processes it in accordance with its own data protection rules.

#### 4. RETENTION TIME

**A1–A3:** Until the processing purpose has been achieved, and in any event no longer than 3 years from the date of publication, or until the data subject has successfully exercised their right to object. The Data Controller reviews the necessity of continued storage on an annual basis.

**A4:** Once the transfer has taken place, no separate retention obligation arises on the part of TPF; the Portal processes the data in accordance with its own EU data protection rules.

**A5:** 5 years from finalisation of the request or legal proceeding.

#### 5. AUTOMATED DECISION-MAKING AND PROFILING

Neither automated decision-making nor profiling within the meaning of Article 22 GDPR occurs in the course of any of the above data processing activities.

#### 6. RIGHTS OF THE DATA SUBJECT

Detailed information on the rights of the data subject can be found in Articles 12–22 of the GDPR. The data subject's right to dispose of their personal data remains valid throughout the duration of the data processing.

The data subject may exercise their rights by sending an e-mail to the Data Protection Officer at the address provided in section 1. The data controller shall examine the request as soon as possible after its submission, but no later than within one month, decide on its merits, and inform the applicant of its decision in writing (primarily by electronic means).

**Right to information** – We provide you with clear and understandable information about the processing of your personal data in a concise, transparent, understandable and easily accessible manner.

**Right of access** – You have the right to receive feedback on whether we process your personal data and, if so, to receive information about the details thereof. As a data subject, you may also request a copy of your processed personal data.

**Right to rectification** – You may request the rectification or completion of inaccurate or incomplete data.

**Right to erasure (“right to be forgotten”)** – We will erase your data if the data processing has achieved its purpose, or if you lawfully object to the processing, if the data processing is unlawful, or if the data must be erased in order to comply with a legal obligation.

**Right to restriction of processing** – You may request restriction of the processing of your data if you believe that the processing is inaccurate, unlawful or unnecessary, or if you object to the processing. In such cases, we will only store the data until we have investigated the above suspicion.

**Right to object** – As a data subject, you have the right to object at any time to the processing of your personal data for the performance of tasks carried out in the public interest. The Data Controller may only continue to process the data if there are compelling legitimate grounds for doing so or for the enforcement of legal claims.

**Right to withdraw consent** – Processing activity A4 (transfer to the European Youth Portal) is based on consent; this consent may be withdrawn at any time. Withdrawal does not affect the lawfulness of processing based on consent prior to its withdrawal.

#### 7. LEGAL REMEDIES

**DPO** – The Data Subject may contact the Data Protection Officer of the Data Controller at the contact details provided in section 1 with any questions, comments or complaints regarding the processing of data. TPF will provide the requested information in writing, preferably by electronic means, as soon as possible and no later than one month after receipt of the request. The procedure for the execution of reasonable requests is free of charge.

**NAIH** – Furthermore, the Data Subject may lodge a complaint with the National Authority for Data Protection and Freedom of Information (address: 1055 Budapest, Falk Miksa u. 9-11.; 1363 Budapest, Pf. 9.; e-mail: [ugyfelszolgalat@naih.hu](mailto:ugyfelszolgalat@naih.hu); [www.naih.hu](http://www.naih.hu)).

**Court** – A data subject may take legal action against TPF if he or she considers that TPF is processing their personal data in violation of the provisions on the processing of personal data laid down by law or by a binding legal act of the European Union.

## **8. MISCELLANEOUS**

**8.1** TPF has implemented appropriate technical and organisational measures to protect personal data against unauthorised access, alteration, disclosure, erasure, accidental destruction or damage.

**8.2** If the Data Controller intends to use personal data for purposes other than those for which they were originally collected, data subjects will be informed in advance and, where required, their consent will be obtained.

**8.3** TPF reserves the right to amend this Notice unilaterally, with notification published on its website.
